REPORTING TO PARENTS

1. Mid-year Reports

With the exception of the tamariki in Waka and a few in Huia (who have interviews after both 6 week and 6 months at school), your child will bring home a school report today.

The first page of the school report has an explanation about how teachers make overall teacher judgements (OTJ) of achievement, by matching our expectations against the National Curriculum Levels. These levels typically relate to the number of years at school, but of course, many students do not fit this pattern. Also due to COVID-19, this year has been extremely disruptive in a variety of ways, with high rates of absenteeism and uncertainty. Teachers have been cautious when making OTJs. You may see this reflected in some learners' levels and comments for students who seem to have made less progress than we would usually see. Hopefully the remainder of the year will be more settled for our learners than the first half.

Generally, each curriculum level takes 2 years to work through.

- Most learners in Years 1 and 2 are working through Level 1
- Most learners in Years 3 and 4 are working through Level 2
- Most learners in Years 5 and 6 are working through Level 3
- Most learners in Years 7 and 8 are working through Level 4

Judgment on how your child is progressing towards meeting end of year expectations.

- Of concern unlikely to make expectations by year end
- Working towards not yet at year end expectation, but with 6 months' progress, likely to meet expectation
- At expectation already at year end expectation
- Above expectation exceeding year end expectation already

2. Celebrating Learning evenings - 2nd and 3rd August (see table at the beginning of this newsletter) Celebrating learning is an open evening inviting parents to come in and chat with all of the teachers in the kete (as your child's whānau teacher may not be their literacy or numeracy teacher). This is a great opportunity for you to spend some time in the kete, the teachers will have some fun activities for you to engage in with your child and you can ask any general follow up questions regarding their report. There is no need to make an appointment, come on in any time between 5.30pm and 6.30pm. You can spend as much or as little time as you like enjoying the classroom environment and sharing learning experiences with your child. We suggest that those with surnames A - L come on the 2nd and those with M-Z on the 3rd. This is just a suggestion to try to balance the numbers over the two nights - if the suggested night is impossible for you, come on the other evening. There is also an opportunity for you to request a follow up appointment with your child's whanau teacher if you have more detailed queries or concerns that are not suitable to be discussed at the Celebrating Learning evenings. We do ask that all adults wear masks when attending our Celebrating Learning evenings.

COVID 19 & INFLUENZA RESPONSE

Mask wearing - We are continuing to strongly encourage the wearing of masks indoors as advised by the Ministry of Health and Ministry of Education. We now have our supply of 'child size masks' and teachers in Years 4, 5 and 6 will distribute these to children who need one each day. We encourage tamariki to continue to bring their own masks, but this is an option.

If adults are coming into buildings, we do ask that you wear a mask - spares are available at the office. We sincerely thank you for your tolerance and patience as we endeavour to protect those who are at higher risk of serious illness with either COVID or influenza.

Good Hygiene Practices - We are ensuring our classrooms have good ventilation. The students hand wash and use hand sanitizer regularly and we are promoting correct sneeze and cough etiquette.

Sickness - If your child is sick keep them home.

We are doing our very best to restrict sudden widespread illness and absences, in the hope of keeping our tamariki and staff healthy, and allowing our Kura to run with minimal interruption to learning programmes.

It's been a great first week back at school, despite the wet weather! Children have settled well back into routines and there is a positive buzz around our Kura.


