## **Update from the Principal**

Kia ora koutou Ngā mihi kia koutou

Welcome to the 2023 school year. It was lovely to see the excited faces pouring in the gate on Tuesday morning. A special welcome to all whānau (families) who are new to Hokowhitu School - we sincerely hope that you will enjoy being part of our school whānau. Please ask if there is anything unclear to you - we will be very happy to help and/or explain further.

#### **SUMMER**

Three quick reminders

- a school regulation sunhat is required for outdoors in Term 1. NO HAT, NO PLAY. Hats are available at the school office for \$12.00
- the sun is fierce at this time of the year. Please ensure sunscreen is applied before coming to school in the morning and pack sunscreen for your child to reapply at break times.
- our swimming pool is solar heated and covered at night. Swimming is part of the school curriculum we expect everyone to take part. Children are to bring their togs/towel/rash top every day. Please email your child's whānau teacher if they are unable to swim for medical reasons. Teachers will not take the tamariki swimming on days that are unsuitable and no child is ever made to stay in the pool after getting cold.

#### **END OF THE DAY ROUTINES**

Tamariki in TKW and TKP are released at 2.45pm from their 'meet and greet' point. As there are no school patrols on duty at that time, for safety reasons we only release the children to their parent/caregiver. Older siblings can be released at 2.45pm if this is needed - just email your child's teacher.

If your child is in TKW or TKP and it is problematic for them to finish at 2.45pm, please email their whānau teacher and tell them you require a 3.00pm release time.

Tamariki in TKM, TKA and TKP are released at 3.00pm when the bell rings and the road patrollers go out to assist with negotiating the traffic flow and the pedestrian crossing.

Please note - DO NOT tell your children to go down to Hokowhitu Park and play after school while they wait to be collected. This area is a public park and we cannot be sure they will be safe unsupervised.
