Sport

Registering for sports teams at Hokowhitu School is a chance for you and your family to become involved in an activity that is outside of school. When you register and pay, the money goes to the sporting association that you register for - e.g. Basketball Manawatu. This money pays for the facilities, people in the association and other miscellaneous things. None of the money goes to the school and this is why we rely on families to support their children by volunteering to coach or manage or supervise at the games. We are struggling more and more for volunteers. We do also reach out to the associations for help and support to find coaches, as well as High Schools and other tertiary institutions.

If your child commits to playing a sport - fantastic! It builds new friendships, relationships and promotes a healthy lifestyle. Helping the team by making sure your child turns up to games, or advising the coach if they are unavailable, is part of that commitment.

When you register on Kindo a question is always at the bottom of the information asking if you are happy to share your personal information with the team that you are entered into - this relates to consent and privacy.

Winter Hockey 2023- Years 1-6


