#### **Update from the Principal**

Kia ora koutou Ngā mihi kia koutou

You will have seen in the upcoming events section of this newsletter that we have **Goal Setting** evenings coming up. At goal setting evenings the tamariki (children) are given a 'run sheet' to guide them in leading you through a series of activities. This will include meeting each teacher in the kete, having a discussion about the way they have settled into the year, routines etc. There will be an opportunity for you to complete a brief online survey that gives us information about how we are managing 'cultural competence' in our kura (school), opportunities to view books, art work etc and generally enjoy sharing the classroom environment. There are no set appointment times, you can spend as much or as little time in the kete as you like. You will leave the kete with a sheet that indicates how your child is progressing following our term 1 assessments, and goals that have been set for literacy and numeracy.

The reason that tamariki in Waka are not included in these sessions is because teachers meet with whānau after your child has been at school for 6 weeks and give you all this information at that time. We will send the survey link home, so you don't miss out on this.

The reason we request that families with surnames A-L come on the **28th of March** and surnames M - Z come on the **30th of March**, is simply to spread the numbers across the school. If your allocated evening is impossible for you to make, please feel free to come on the other night. Teachers look forward to meeting with you and encourage every whānau to come along.

#### **TEACHER'S STRIKE**

NZEI, the primary teacher's union, has been negotiating with the Ministry of Education around the terms and conditions of their collective employment agreement which has expired.

Members have voted to strike because they believe the funding for our schools is not sufficient to give teachers the time and resources to teach.

NZEI has called a national strike scheduled for next Thursday the 16th of March. Reluctantly, this means that we need to advise that there will be no regular programmes at school next Thursday.

You will receive a note on Monday asking you to keep your tamariki home next Thursday if at all possible. (The supervision available at school will be limited).

This includes upgrading the pipes running from the public toilets to our wastewater network near the road. We have attached a picture of the worksite over the page for you.


Our contractors are starting on Monday 6 March, and they expect to finish by late March. They'll be working weekdays, between 7:30am to 5pm, and they're doing the work in two stages, so you won't see them onsite all the time.

You'll see some machinery and safety fencing where they're working. They'll try to keep any disruption to a minimum, but there will be some noise during the day as they work.

While the playing field remains open, a small section of the car park will be unavailable to the public during the period of work.




