COMMUNITY CONSULTATION FEEDBACK

Further analysis of the recent survey -

How satisfied are you that Hokowhitu School is inclusive and respectful of cultural diversity? 86% of all respondents were 'satisfied', 12% were neutral and the remaining 3% unsatisfied. 76% of our Māori respondents were 'satisfied', 21% neutral and the remaining 3% unsatisfied.

Responses to events or celebrations that are important to your culture that you would like to see incorporated into the school year included:

Diwali, Eid/Ramadan, Easter/Christmas, Pōwhiri, Thanksgiving, Dance from different cultures, Chinese New Year, Singing God Save the King, Solstices/equinoxes.

How satisfied are you that students are taught effectively how to manage relationships and deal with conflict? 63% of all respondents were satisfied, 32% neutral and 4% unsatisfied. 62% of our Māori respondents were 'satisfied', 31% neutral and the remaining 6% unsatisfied.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to participate in this survey. I will continue to share responses next term.
