Update from the Principal

Kia ora koutou Ngā mihi kia koutou

At our meeting this week, the Board started to unpack the responses received in our recent community consultation. Over the coming weeks I will share responses to specific questions - so everyone can see what most people thought.

- Our current mission statement as guiding philosophy for our school is 'Torongia ki ti kihi ō te maunga striving to get to the top of the mountain'. 75% of ALL respondents thought it appropriate or highly appropriate and 9% thought it inappropriate. The remainder were neutral.
 Our Māori whānau responded similarly with 75% thinking it appropriate or highly appropriate and 11% thinking it inappropriate.
- 2. In response to 'how appropriate do you feel our current 'STRIVE' values are for shaping our school community?' 86% of ALL respondents thought them either appropriate or highly appropriate, 10% thought them inappropriate and the remainder were neutral.
 Our Māori whānau responded similarly with 85% of responses rating them appropriate or highly appropriate, and 11% inappropriate.

These responses give us a clear direction to continue developing and fostering these values and statements. Thank you. Next week I will share some more results with you.

TE AŌ MĀORI HUI - 27th June at 5pm - starting in the hall

We are excited to be offering an evening to celebrate Te Aō Māori (all things Māori), combined with our very important Whānau Hui (this was postponed last term).

Kapa Haka will perform for us, each kete will have activities for you to enjoy with the tamariki, there will be hot soup and bread rolls on offer, whānau will be warmly welcomed to 'drop into' the staffroom and share your ideas about the things we are doing well for our Māori ākonga and the things you'd like to see us do more of or introduce.

We'd love everyone to come to this celebration - the staff would welcome you coming into each kete to enjoy the activities they have prepared.

We will gladly accept a donation of a soup vegetable (eg carrot, pumpkin, potato, leek, celery etc) to add to our soup stock - these can be sent to school at the end of next week or on the Monday before our hui on Tuesday. If you can loan us your crockpot or soup ladle, please let your child's whānau teacher know (and ensure they are clearly named when you bring them into school).

A note came home this week inviting you to make a vegetable donation and also asking for assistance to prepare the vegetables on the Monday afternoon before the hui on Tuesday. Please check school bags if you haven't seen it.

SCHOOL UNIFORM - FOOTWEAR

Our school uniform requests that the tamariki wear 'black or brown footwear that is school sensible'.

We are noticing an increasing number of 'unsuitable' shoes being worn to school.

For example, crocs are not considered school sensible (and the gibbitz/charms are targets to go missing), neither are 'heelies'.

Plain black sneaker type footwear is perfect as it is suited to PE activities too. Please ensure velcro closures if your child cannot tie their own laces.

Our recent community consultation survey indicated a strong preference for maintaining a school uniform (78% of respondents thought it either important or highly important, and a further 15% didn't mind either way), so please support this by ensuring your tamariki come to school in the correct school uniform. Thank you.

Next Wednesday we have two teams competing in this tournament. Congratulations and best wishes for a great day!

REPORTING TO PARENTS

Teachers have been busy completing mid-year assessments and are continuing to write reports. Reports will come home at the end of Week 1 of next term. (The only children not receiving a mid-year report are those children in their first year of school who have recently had or will soon be having either a 6 week or 6-month interview with your child's whānau teacher).

The following week we will be holding Celebrating Learning evenings - inviting you to come into school with your tamariki and see and hear more about their learning. As usual there is the opportunity to speak with each of the teachers that works with your child, not just their whanau teacher.
