# Update from the Principal

Kia ora koutou Ngā mihi kia koutou

Welcome to Term 3 everyone! A very special welcome to the tamariki/whānau who are new to our kura (school). We held a mihi whakatau just before morning tea on Monday morning to particularly say 'nau mai, haere mai' - welcome! My sincere thanks to Ms Finikin and the senior Kapa Haka roopu who supported us with this.

We hope that everyone new to our kura feels well supported and I hope you have a long and positive association with Hokowhitu School.

#### **COMMUNITY CONSULTATION FEEDBACK**

Further analysis of the recent survey -

How satisfied are you with the physical safety of your child/children at Hokowhitu School? 82% of all respondents were 'satisfied', 16% were neutral and the remaining 2% unsatisfied. 82% of our Māori respondents were 'satisfied', 10% neutral and the remaining 6% unsatisfied.

How satisfied are you with the emotional safety of your child/children at Hokowhitu School? 74% of all respondents were satisfied, 20% neutral and 6% unsatisfied. 65% of our Māori respondents were 'satisfied', 21% neutral and the remaining 13% unsatisfied.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to participate in this survey last term. I will continue to share responses in the coming weeks.

In addition to sharing these results, we are also looking closely to see if there are patterns and/or areas that we can strengthen further.

#### MID YEAR REPORTS

Please check school bags today for mid-year reports (and a letter advising attendance rates, if your child's attendance is lower than the Ministry of Education's expectation).

We trust that you will enjoy reading about the progress being made towards learning goals.

In both literacy and numeracy kaiako (teachers) have also made an 'overall teacher judgment' about each child's progress towards meeting the END OF YEAR expectations.

If we have concerns that your child is unlikely to meet expectations - 'Of concern' will have been indicated. If we consider that your child is tracking well and likely to meet expectations by the end of the year - 'on track' has been indicated.

If your child is already at the end of year expectation - 'at expectation' has been ticked.

If your child is currently learning at a level higher than the end of year expectation - 'exceeding expectation' has been indicated.

It is hugely important to celebrate and recognise progress, successes and the effort put in, rather than only considering the outcome as important. We teach every single child 'from where they are at' and work to progress them from that point.

Staff look forward to your coming to one of our Celebrating Learning evenings next week so you can further explore books, activities, and chat informally with staff too.

#### **CELEBRATING LEARNING - 25TH OR 27TH JULY**

We hope that everyone will take the opportunity to come along and enjoy spending some time with your child in their kete next week. Teachers have planned a range of activities and things for you to enjoy, and they also look forward to having time to chat with you informally about anything you'd like further clarification or information around.

If it is not possible for you to attend on your allocated night, it is fine to come on the other night. We are simply trying to spread numbers evenly, so you don't spend too much time waiting to chat to staff. There are no set appointment times, you can stay for as little (or as much) time as you like within the allocated times we are open. The final bell will ring at 6.45pm, so allow yourself enough time to be finished by then.

One of the activities we will be inviting you to complete next week is to give us some feedback about our current health/wellbeing programme here at school. After consulting with whānau we will be able to see the programmes/actions that you highly value us teaching at school and also see any areas that we could potentially strengthen.

#### BASIC FACT-A-THON - forms came home at the end of last term

Excitement is building as the tamariki grow their basic facts knowledge in preparation for the basic fact-a-thon on the 10th of August. It is great to hear parents saying their child is completing the sheet daily and seeing if they can get faster and faster!!

Both 'number' and 'basic fact' knowledge are key parts of success in mathematics. It is completely optional as to whether the ākonga participate in the fundraising aspect of this activity - however having some sponsors can be hugely motivating to practise drill learning these facts.

All sponsorship forms need to be returned by Friday 4th August (even if they are empty) in preparation for testing the following week.

If you need another sheet (either to practise or for more sponsors) please email your child's whānau teacher or ask for another at next week's Celebrating Learning evening.

The PTA will offer 'prizes' for the top fundraisers in this event, so we encourage you to take this opportunity to raise some funds to support the school in replacing/modernising the senior playground.
