Update from the Principal

Kia ora koutou Ngā mihi kia koutou

<u>DISCO</u>

Everyone will have received details/information via the school app (and by email) earlier this week regarding tonight's disco. Only people who have prepaid for tickets may come - we have no space for door sales, sorry. We very much appreciate those adults (both staff and whānau) who have put their hand up to assist with preparation and/or support during the event. I am VERY grateful for the way our staff give their own whānau time to support the tamariki. Tino pai - I appreciate you!

BALLOT FOR OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS - 6th September

We have 2 vacancies for out of zone enrolments at each of Years 2/3/4/5/6 for Term 4 of this year. We are also accepting requests for enrolment for out of zone tamariki turning 5 in Terms 1 or 2 of next year. A ballot (if needed) will be held on the 6th of September.

If you know someone who lives 'out of zone' who would like to attend our kura, please encourage them to collect and complete an enrolment form and return it before the 4th of September.

This applies to siblings of current pupils too. Please DO NOT assume we will know when they will be turning 5 and expect us to hold a place for them. Our Board is committed to keeping siblings together, however we do need to have the application in before ballot time, so we don't give their space away to someone else.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION FEEDBACK

Further analysis of the recent survey -

How satisfied are you with the effectiveness of the following methods of reporting your child/children's progress?

Responses from **all** respondents indicated 42% were satisfied with goal setting/celebrating learning evenings, 42% were neutral, and 15% were unsatisfied.

Online/zoom teacher appointments met with satisfaction from 51%, 43% were neutral, and 6% unsatisfied. Face to face teacher appointments met with 65% satisfaction, 30% neutral, and 5% unsatisfied.

Responses from our Māori respondents indicated 38% were satisfied with goal setting/celebrating evenings, 52% neutral, and 10% unsatisfied.

Online/soom appointments met with 45% satisfaction from respondents, 41% neutral and 13% unsatisfied. Face to face teacher appointments met with 58% satisfaction, 34% neutral, and 7% unsatisfied.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to participate in this survey last term. I will continue to share responses in the coming weeks.

In addition to sharing these results, we are also looking closely to see if there are patterns and/or areas that we can strengthen further.

BASIC FACT-A-THON - forms came home at the end of last term
