BALLOT FOR OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS - 6th September

We have 2 vacancies for out of zone enrolments at each of Years 2/3/4/5/6 for Term 4 of this year.

We are also accepting requests for enrolment for out of zone tamariki turning 5 in Terms 1 or 2 of next year.

A ballot (if needed) will be held on the 6th of September.

If you know someone who lives 'out of zone' who would like to attend our kura, please encourage them to collect and complete an enrolment form and return it before the 4th of September.

This applies to siblings of current pupils too. Please **DO NOT** assume we will know when they will be turning 5 and expect us to hold a place for them. Our Board is committed to keeping siblings together, however we do need to have the application in before ballot time, so we don't give their space away to someone else.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION FEEDBACK

Further analysis of last term's survey -

How satisfied are you with the quality of the classrooms at Hokowhitu School

Responses from **all** respondents indicated 84% satisfied, 11% neutral and 6% unsatisfied Responses from our Māori respondents indicated 86% satisfied, 10% neutral and 3% unsatisfied.

How satisfied are you with the quality of the outdoor facilities and environment at Hokowhitu School?

Responses from all respondents indicated 88% satisfied, 7% neutral and 5% unsatisfied.

Responses from our Māori respondents indicated 87% satisfied, 3% neutral and 10% unsatisfied.


