#### **IMPORTANT REMINDERS FOR 2024**

- 1. The Board has requested that we place more emphasis on correct uniform footwear from next year. Socks should be navy blue, shoes should be black or brown and 'school sensible'. ### Update from the School Board

Congratulations on making it to the end of the year!

The School Board recently held its last meeting for 2023. One key item of business was approving a strategic plan for the next two years, which is a new requirement of the Ministry of Education. Building on the consultation that has occurred this year, we have identified four goals for accelerated improvement: improving literacy and numeracy, understanding te ao Māori, acknowledging diversity and enhancing wellbeing. We have set targets in each of these areas, and each year we will develop a plan to help us work towards them. The strategic plan will soon be available on the school website, and next year you'll see the four goals displayed around the school. We're also excited to announce that construction of the new senior playground will commence at

the start of the next school year! This is a major investment that has been made possible by Lin's careful management of the school's finances over many years. We also gratefully acknowledge the generous support of Pub Charity, which has committed \$25,000 to the project. On the Board, Villi Tosi has put a huge amount of work into planning, while Rachel Buckley wrote the grant application. We wish all our school community, students, and staff a relaxing, joyful, and safe summer break.
