# **Update from the Principal**

Kia ora koutou Ngā mihi kia koutou

Hooray! The school pool is balanced and ready for swimming. Thanks to our solar heating system and pool covers we are able to maintain much warmer temperatures than the 'old days' when we simply had to rely on sunshine. Swimming is part of the NZ curriculum. As NZ is a country surrounded by water, being able to swim is a vital survival skill to have. We urge you to support us with this potentially lifesaving skill by ensuring the children understand we expect them to learn to swim.

Please send the tamariki to school daily with their togs, towel (and goggles if you have them) in a waterproof bag.

We strongly encourage rash tops (or sun safe togs) to limit the effect of sunburn.

Please be assured that the kaiako (teachers) WILL NOT take the tamariki swimming when the weather is unsuitable. Neither will they insist that a child stays in the water if they are feeling cold.

BUSES ARE CHANGING IN PALMERSTON NORTH

From 19 February 2024, bus routes and frequencies are changing in Palmerston North as we bring more direct and easy-to-understand bus routes to the city. On top of that, we are also introducing New Zealand's first, fully electric bus network. Here are some of the exciting things for ETC students and staff to know:

- · Significant infrastructure improvements at bus stops, with more bus shelters and more accessible bus stops around the city, including better lighting at stops.
- · Improvements to real-time information, with real-time departure boards at major bus stops in the city.
- · Increased frequency of buses, running every 15 minutes from 7:00-9:00, and again from 3:00pm-6:00pm, Monday to Friday. Every 30 minutes outside of those hours and on weekends
- Earlier and later bus services, with the first bus starting at 6:30am, and the last departure at 9:00pm, 7 days a week.

## On behalf of the Palmerston North City Council

We wanted to let you know that today we're launching an educational campaign to remind both residents and visitors of the importance of safety when parking.

Over the past year, we've noticed more and more people parking dangerously around our city, especially in residential areas and around schools. Between July 2022 and July 2023, we issued 228 tickets for people parking over cycle lanes and footpaths. From November 21 until New Year's Eve, we will be giving out warnings with educational material to anyone who parks over footpaths and on cycle lanes to remind people of the parking rules and to make our roads and footpaths safer for all road users.

Our focus will be on central streets as well as residential areas.

When someone receives a warning, this will be logged into our system and if it happens again then a fine (infringement) will be issued.

We will continue issuing infringements for vehicles if they are parked on yellow lines and at bus stops.

After 1 January 2024, we will return to issuing infringements to all people parking unsafely and breaking the law in all spaces, including on footpaths and cycle lanes.

We also want to make people aware they can make a complaint about unsafe parking via the 'snap send solve' app or on our website at www.pncc.govt.nz/parkright

Before January 1, if people log a complaint that a vehicle has parked over a footpath or over a cycle lane, wardens will attempt to visit the location if it was recent, and if they find the vehicle they will be issued with a warning with educational material. If the vehicle cannot be found, the registered owner of the vehicle will receive a letter stating that their car was spotted being parked in an unsafe situation with educational information. They cannot be issued warnings if our wardens do not see the vehicle parked like that.

Here's some key messages that you're welcome to share with your school community.

**Never park over a footpath:** We know people don't intentionally choose to park over a footpath (well, we hope not!), but sometimes while waiting in the vehicle crossing or driveway, their car can cover part or all of the footpath. Our footpaths need to remain clear for people to use, especially our tamariki. When footpaths are blocked, people have to either go onto a person's property or move onto the road to get around.

**Parking in a cycleway puts people on bikes at risk:** Cycleways are for people on bikes- not parked cars. If bike riders must veer around a parked vehicle, it's more dangerous for them.

**If e-scooters are on the footpath, call the e-scooter company:** If you can lift the e-scooter off the footpath, please do so. If it is too heavy or you are not able to, please call the e-scooter company and let them know it is blocking a footpath. They can arrange for it to be moved.







## Hey kids! Want to take part in the Christmas Parade?

We have a category for decorated bikes. So get you and your bike all looking like Christmas and you could win a prize. All entrants get to take part in the parade.

Entry conditions—you need to be between 4 and 12 years old, and have a bike that you can ride around the parade route (approx. 900m). You can bring a big person to walk with you if you need one. You will need to wear a helmet, so plan your design around that.
