Welcome to the first official day of summer - let's hope someone 'in charge' realises that means we are soon expecting sunshine and warmer days.

## SWIMMING

Hooray! The school pool is balanced and ready for swimming. Thanks to our solar heating system and pool covers we are able to maintain much warmer temperatures than the 'old days' when we simply had to rely on sunshine. Swimming is part of the NZ curriculum. As NZ is a country surrounded by water, being able to swim is a vital survival skill to have. We urge you to support us with this potentially lifesaving skill by ensuring the children understand we expect them to learn to swim.

Please send the tamariki to school daily with their togs, towel (and goggles if you have them) in a waterproof bag.

We strongly encourage rash tops (or sun safe togs) to limit the effect of sunburn.

Please be assured that the kaiako (teachers) WILL NOT take the tamariki swimming when the weather is unsuitable. Neither will they insist that a child stays in the water if they are feeling cold.

## PLATE TO PLATE

"Everyone in Year 6 participated in the Plant to Plate programme this year. The programme was run mostly by volunteers. We planted some rocket, spring onions, sweet corn, and lavender in the Hokowhitu School Garden. After gardening, they helped us prepare many dishes all made with vegetables or fruit. We learned how to hold a knife properly, how to cut vegetables properly, and other ways to be safe in the kitchen. Our favourite recipe was the banana and feijoa smoothie".

BUSES ARE CHANGING IN PALMERSTON NORTH

From 19 February 2024, bus routes and frequencies are changing in Palmerston North as we bring more direct and easy-to-understand bus routes to the city. On top of that, we are also introducing New Zealand's first, fully electric bus network. Here are some of the exciting things for ETC students and staff to know:

 $\cdot$  Significant infrastructure improvements at bus stops, with more bus shelters and more accessible bus stops around the city, including better lighting at stops.

- Improvements to real-time information, with real-time departure boards at major bus stops in the city.
- Increased frequency of buses, running every 15 minutes from 7:00-9:00, and again from 3:00pm-6:00pm, Monday to Friday. Every 30 minutes outside of those hours and on weekends

• Earlier and later bus services, with the first bus starting at 6:30am, and the last departure at 9:00pm, 7 days a week.

### We're upgrading the watermain on Railway Road

We are letting you know about an upcoming watermain renewal project.



The purpose of this project is to upgrade the water network on both sides of Railway Road, between Tremaine Ave and the railway bridge. The job will commence on 1 December and is expected to be completed by the end of February.

Our team is planning to work on one side of the road before Christmas before moving to the other side after Christmas.

Traffic management: Two lanes of traffic will be maintained during the work period, but speeds will be reduced to 30km/h. There will be minor periods where stop/go signs are used as we upgrade the pipes across the width of the road.

Entry/Exit on Tremaine: We're asking any big businesses to use their entry/exits on Tremaine Ave rather than using Railway Rd during the construction period.

Water shutdown period: There will be water shutdown periods at different stages of the project to test the new connections. Your business will receive a letter with at least 48 hours' notice of the scheduled shutdown, and these are likely to occur outside normal business hours.

Chat to our team onsite: If you have any questions or you would like an update during the work period, a senior team leader will be onsite to chat with you each Thursday between 1-2pm.

We'll also be returning to rebuild the section of Railway Road between the bridge and Tremaine Ave next year. This work will be completed in two stages over the next two summers. We'll keep you updated when we secure a contractor.
