FAREWELL AND THANK YOU

Mrs Nikki Christian leaves at the end of this year. She has been a learning coach at our kura for the last 4 years. We have appreciated you sharing all of your skills Nikki and we wish you well for the future.

<u>SWIMMING</u>

The pool temperature has been much warmer than the air temperature this week.

Swimming is part of the NZ curriculum. As NZ is a country surrounded by water, being able to swim is a vital survival skill to have. We urge you to support us with this potentially lifesaving skill by ensuring the children understand we expect them to learn to swim.

Please send the tamariki to school daily with their togs, towel (and goggles if you have them) in a waterproof bag. We strongly encourage rash tops (or sun safe togs) to limit the effect of sunburn.

Please be assured that the kaiako (teachers) WILL NOT take the tamariki swimming when the weather is unsuitable. Neither will they insist that a child stays in the water if they are feeling cold.





ND OF YEAR REPORTS AND 2024 TRANSITIONS

School reports will come home in school bags today. If your child has recently had a 6 week or a 6-month conference, you will have received both an oral and a written summary already, so there will not be another report.

Everyone returning to our kura next year will also receive a stationery list for the kete they are going to be in next year. Stationery can be purchased from wherever you like, however we ask that you specifically take notice of the brand of glue

stick requested - 'not all glue sticks are created equally' and some brands of glue sticks simply break or don't stick! Complete stationery packs will be available at Palmerston North's Warehouse Stationery (and online) from the 15th of

January.

On Tuesday the 12th of December the ākonga will spend some time in their 2024 learning space. They will get to meet their classmates and kaiako. Having this short time together relieves some of the worry about the 'unknown' aspect of a new year.

The prizegiving commences at 6pm. We expect the ākonga (learners) to be present for this event, along with parental support. We plan this event to conclude by 7pm. The Year 6 graduation ceremony will take place for the Year 6 ākonga and whānau immediately following prizegiving.



SCHOOL HELPERS

UNIFORM UPDATE

The School Board would like to share news about some changes to the Hokowhitu School uniform next year. Our community consultation survey has told us that you greatly value having a uniform! We want to make sure this is as affordable as possible for parents and caregivers, and to encourage our students to wear it with pride.

Shorts, skorts, and trousers

We have decided to change to a more cost-effective range of blue shorts, skorts, and trousers that feature the school logo. These will be available from our uniform supplier, Academy Apparel, starting in term 2.

- During term 1, our current grey shorts and trousers and tartan skorts will continue to be available for purchase at Academy Apparel. Used items will also continue to be available for purchase at the school office.
- To minimise the financial impact of this change, students will be able to wear their current grey shorts and trousers and tartan skorts until the end of 2025.

Shoes, sandals, socks, and tights

We have also decided to reaffirm our uniform style of **navy socks and tights, and "school sensible" black or brown shoes and sandals**. ("School sensible" footwear looks tidy and allows students to participate in physical education). Currently our students wear a wide range of non-uniform footwear, and we acknowledge that we have allowed this to occur.

- Starting in the new year, we ask that all students are sent to school in uniform footwear, and we will be sending reminders home if this is not the case. We want to reassure you that no children will be singled out, shamed, or excluded from education while we are undergoing this reset.
- If any families are unable to afford appropriate footwear, please contact the school office so that we can provide support.
