We can consider ourselves extremely fortunate here in Manawatu, but many people will have whānau/friends/loved ones in areas that are suffering hugely. This can cause worries or anxiety even for people not directly affected, especially while communication and direct contact is so challenging. As a staff we will support the tamariki in an 'age appropriate' manner. Please let us know if you notice changes in your own children, we will help in any way possible.

### DONATIONS TO SEND TO HAWKES BAY (PTS Logistics sponsored)

We have been made aware of containers being filled to distribute to those who have been displaced or are in desperate need of support. Our staff is supporting this initiative.

#### EDUCATION OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM (EOTC)

Each kete has a range of exciting activities planned for the coming week. EOTC week culminates in our whole school 'Big Day Out' next Friday.
