### BALLOT FOR OUT OF ZONE NEW ENTRANTS - TERMS 1 AND 2 OF 2023

Do you have a child starting school in the first half of 2023? Do you know someone who would like their child to attend Hokowhitu School in 2023? Along with places for New Entrants we are likely to have up to 5 spaces for students entering Years 3 and 4 in 2023.

Now is a good time to pick up pre-enrolment information and return it to the school office before the ballot in September. A reminder that you do still need to enter the ballot if you are out of zone but have siblings already at the school (our Board has committed to supporting all applications that fit this criteria) but you must have the enrolment information in before the ballot - we cannot hold a space assuming you will be coming.

### **REPORTING TO PARENTS**

### 1. Mid-year Reports

With the exception of the tamariki in Waka and a few in Huia (who have interviews after both 6 week and 6 months at school), teachers have completed mid-year assessments and are currently writing mid-year reports. These reports come home on the first Friday of next term.

The first page of the school report has an explanation about how teachers make overall teacher judgements of achievement, by matching our expectations against the National Curriculum Levels. These levels typically relate to the number of years at school, but of course, many students do not fit this pattern.

Generally, each curriculum level takes 2 years to work through.

Most learners in Years 1 and 2 are working through Level 1

Most learners in Years 3 and 4 are working through Level 2

Most learners in Years 5 and 6 are working through Level 3

Most learners in Years 7 and 8 are working through Level 4

We teach the learner from where they are at, this means they may be learning at a level lower than expected, or they may be learning at a level higher than expected.

Please see the table on the report to show the approximate correlation between Year levels and National Curriculum levels.

2. <u>Celebrating Learning evenings - 2nd and 3rd August</u> (see table at the beginning of this newsletter) The following week we hold open evenings inviting parents to come in, chat with all of the teachers in the kete (as your child's whānau teacher may not be their literacy or numeracy teacher). This is a great opportunity for you to spend some time in the kete, the teachers will have some fun activities for you to engage in with your child and you can ask any general follow up questions regarding the report.

There is no need to make an appointment, come on in any time between 5.30pm and 6.30pm and spend as much or as little time as you like enjoying the classroom environment and sharing learning experiences with your child. We suggest that those with surnames A - L come on the 2nd and those with M-Z on the 3rd. This is just a suggestion to try to balance the numbers over the two nights - if the suggested night is impossible for you, come on the other evening. There is also an opportunity for you to request a follow up appointment with your child's whanau teacher if you have more detailed queries or concerns that are not suitable to be answered at Celebrating Learning.

### **ICAS Assessment 2022 Information**

Hokowhitu School is giving Year 4, 5 and 6 students the opportunity to participate in ICAS Assessments<sup>™</sup> this year.

ICAS is designed to target students' higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Writing, Spelling Bee and Digital Technologies.

Each assessment celebrates students' accomplishments by providing opportunities for recognition and development. Every student will receive a printed certificate and an online results report. Top performers will be eligible for medals and are invited to attend special award ceremonies to have their academic excellence publicly recognised.

The assessments are suitable for students wishing to extend themselves academically and take up the personal challenge of competing in an international assessment. Your child will be presented with high-quality, expert-developed questions, allowing them to apply their learning without the need for prior study or revision.






