YEAR 4 - 6 TRIATHLON

We welcome supporters/spectators for the triathlon on Tuesday, so do come along if you can. Where possible, bring bikes and helmets to school on Monday for the rehearsal (and we will store them indoors overnight).

Racing starts at 9.30 am with the tamariki completing 2 events, followed by the Year 6 tamariki, then the Year 5, and finishing with Year 4's.

We respectfully ask that supporters stay off race areas, finish lines etc, so that everyone gets a fair go.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS FOR 2024

1. The Board has requested that we place more emphasis on correct uniform footwear. Socks should be navy-blue, shoes should be black or brown and 'school sensible'. If girls are wearing tights, they are to be plain navy-blue tights with feet (NOT leggings). **Please ensure the tamariki are wearing these items daily.**

We want to take a positive approach to getting this right, so reminder notes will be sent home regularly if tamariki are not wearing appropriate footwear. Thanks for your support with this.

2. Regulation sunhats are compulsory in Term 1. Hats are available from the school office for \$12.00. No hat, no play. This will be enforced from next Monday, so get your hat sorted before next week.

3. The school office hours are 8.30am - 4.00pm.

4. Togs (preferably sunsafe) and a towel should be sent to school daily - swimming is a part of the NZ curriculum, not something the children 'choose' to opt in or out of.
