Update from the Principal

Kia ora koutou Ngā mihi kia koutou

It is with great excitement that we can let you know that work commences on the replacement of the senior playground NEXT WEEK! The anticipated finish date is at the end of March!

We will be talking with the tamariki about staying well clear of the area while the work is being completed (it will of course all be fenced off), however we request that you also reinforce the importance of this. It will be fabulous to have this completed - special thanks to Villi and Rachel (from the School Board) who have both had significant roles in either co-ordinating the project or securing a grant to assist with costs. Sincere thanks to the current and previous Boards who have prudently managed the finances to enable us to have reserves to put into resourcing this.

YEAR 5 AND 6 UPCOMING CAMPS

Camp week is next week!!

Thanks to everyone who is (or has) made payments - the **total amount requested is \$150.00**. This is thanks to a successful grant (ka pai to Rachel Buckley for your mahi in securing this), along with PTA and Board support. It is absolutely fine for you to make camp payments in instalments if this makes balancing the budget easier - we are well aware that money is much harder to earn than it is to spend! A few dollars each week works just as well.

GOAL SETTING EVENINGS

The teachers are currently completing assessments to determine each child's next learning steps. At the upcoming goal setting evenings you have the opportunity to speak with each of the teachers in the kete, share some learning together and hear about your tamariki's current learning goals.

There is no need to make an appointment, just come in between 5.30 and 6.30pm on your day and stay for as long as you'd like.

As a general concept we ask that those who have surnames beginning with A - L come on the 26 March and those with surnames M - Z come on the 27 March. This just helps us balance the numbers over the two evenings. However, if it's not possible for you to come on your night, choose the other.

At the goal setting evening you can request an appointment if you wish to speak in more detail with your child's whānau teacher. Please be aware that their whānau teacher may not be their literacy or numeracy teacher.

As many of the children in Waka will soon be due their 6-week check (which is followed up with a short interview), Mrs Hodge and Miss Caldwell will only be present on ONE of these nights - TUES 26.



A MESSAGE FROM PALMERSTON NORTH CITY COUNCIL

BUSES ARE CHANGING IN PALMERSTON NORTH

From 4 March 2024, bus routes and frequencies are changing in Palmerston North as we bring more direct and easy-to-understand bus routes to the city. On top of that, we are also introducing New Zealand's first, fully electric bus network.

- Significant infrastructure improvements at bus stops, with more, new bus shelters and more accessible bus stops around the city, including better lighting at stops.
- 43 Brand new EV buses will be on the road, creating a comfortable and quiet ride to work, study, and leisure
- Increased frequency of buses, running every 15 minutes from 7:00am-9:00, and again from 3:00pm-6:00pm, Monday to Friday. Every 30 minutes outside of those hours and on weekends.
- Direct town to Palmerston North Airport bus line, 7 days a week.
- Increased frequency to Ashhurst, including services on Saturdays & Sundays
- Earlier and later bus services, with the first bus starting at 6:30am, and the last departure at 9:00pm, 7 days a
- Real time departure boards soon to be installed at stops, providing live departure time updates for buses at that stop.
- Download the Transit App on your phone and get live departures and helpful information for your trip.

Our new bus timetables are available on the Horizons website (<u>found here</u>) and print copies are available at the Horizons Office, the Palmerston North I-site, and will be on bus from 4 March 2024.


