#### **UPDATE FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

Kia ora koutou Ngā mihi kia koutou

Yesterday we hosted kaiako (teachers) from 7 other schools, and a numeracy facilitator from The Learner First. While the primary purpose of the day was to provide professional development for the kaiako, several classes participated in maths workshops with the group. The teachers involved in the PD then share their learning with the rest of the staff - so we can all become even more effective teachers of mathematics.

This is an example of us working towards our first strategic goal:

Ensuring that all ākonga gain confidence and experience success in literacy and numeracy.

#### What is ICAS?

ICAS is an online academic competition that gives students the opportunity to challenge their higher order thinking and problem-solving skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Writing, Spelling Bee, and Digital Technologies. Hokowhitu School offers this to Year 4 - 6 students who want to test their academic talents.

Every student who participates is celebrated and recognised with a printed certificate in each subject area, and an online results report to track development each year. Top performers are eligible for one of the highly coveted ICAS medals.

- **6**. Enter your child's details, select the subject areas your child would like to participate in, then proceed to payment.

Please note that the ICAS subject areas shown for selection are at the school's discretion. After payment is made via the Parent Payment System, you will receive an order confirmation email, please keep this for your records.

#### **ICAS** results and certificates

All assessments will be conducted online, at school. We will notify you of the date(s) that we will run ICAS assessments, and when your child's ICAS results are ready. Your child's ICAS certificates will be delivered to school. Once we have received them, we will present them to your child to bring home. The back of the certificate will show your child's ICAS results and the login details, "TAP ID and Pin". - Use these to enter the Results Portal <a href="mailto:orti.icasassessments.com/ortiStudent">orti.icasassessments.com/ortiStudent</a>.
