CHESS CHAMPIONS

On Tuesday 13th of August, we sent our top 4 ranked chess players (Jamie, Alex N, Joshpreet and Senura) to the Manawatu Schools Chess Teams Championships, held at the Takaro Bowling Club.



"After a nervous first two rounds, the players found their rhythm and quickly climbed the leader board alongside Opiki, Aokautare and Te Kura Kaupapa from Dannevirke. We placed 3rd with two rounds remaining, we had a hard-fought victory over Opiki to move into 1st= place for the final round. The final battle was intense, but Hokowhitu overcame Aokautare 3 games to 1 to take out the championship for the first time. A special mention to **Joshpreet S** who was 1st= for the top ranked player on the day.

The team has now qualified for the National Interschool Finals in Wellington on 28-29 September". Mr Evans.




