Kia ora koutou Ngā mihi kia koutou

Next week New Zealand/Aotearoa celebrates Māori Language Week

Māori Language Week has been celebrated in Aotearoa since 1975. This special week is an opportunity for the concentrated celebration and promotion of te reo Māori, helping to secure its future as a living, dynamic, and rich language.

In the mid-20th century, there were concerns that the Māori language was dying out. The future of te reo Māori was the subject of a Waitangi Tribunal claim in 1985. The tribunal's recommendations led to far-reaching legislative and policy changes. Māori became an official language of New Zealand in 1987. Te Taura Whiri i te Reo Māori was established in the same year to promote te reo.

Te Wiki o te Reo Māori is part of a broad Māori language revival programme and raises public awareness for Māori language learning and public usage. <u>Mahuru Māori</u> is an initiative begun in 2017 to promote the use of te reo Māori throughout September.

Kaiako (teachers) will be giving extra celebration and promotion of te re Māori over the week.

This is an example of us working towards our second strategic goal Increasing ākonga and kaiako knowledge of and engagement with te ao Māori





aPlus School Holiday Programme



aPlus offers the following School Holiday Programmes:

Explorers:

The aPlus Explorers programme is a mixture of centre-based activities (Stay and Play), and excursions (Out and About), for children 7 years and up. This programme offers a chance for children to experience out and about activities or to have special guests come into the centre to see them.

Holiday Fun

The aPlus Holiday Fun programme is a centre-based programme for children aged 7 years and up. Children experience the camaraderie of peers they will be with most days. They will be involved in simple cooking, building, art experimentation, sports and games, physical literacy, and teamwork problem solving.

The Small Fry Programme at aPlus -

Small Fry is the aPlus Holiday centre-based programme for **5 & 6 year old** children. The programme is planned and paced for this age group and gives the younger children the opportunity to flourish in the programme without having to compete or try keep up with their older peers. The children will be able to have morning tea and lunch with their older peers and when they turn **7** they will be able to go to the Explorers or Holiday Fun programme.

Awatea

Awatea is the aPlus programme for ages <u>9 years and up.</u> There is a mix of adventure-based activities (e.g. paintball), excursions (e.g. Ten Pin Bowling, Escape Rooms), sports (e.g. Ultimate Frisbee), and challenge (e.g. Shop, Cook, Eat, Win)! This programme is planned to take the children into a world of DOING, not just looking at it on a screen! Some programmes are capped and this will show when booking.

What to bring to aPlus - Morning Tea, Lunch, Hat, Warm jumper, Imagination

What to leave at home - Toys, Phones, Devices, Best Clothes, the Grumps

Lunch Note for Parents/Caregivers - If you are sending noodles for lunch, we will do all packets of noodles of same flavour in a pot together.

Doing the noodles packet by packet takes too long for hungry children. Just fill out the **Heat and Eat** form at Sign In, so we know what noodles your child has brought with them for lunch. We thank you and the hungry children thank you!!!
