UPDATE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Kia ora koutou Ngā mihi kia koutou

At the Board meeting earlier this week our Board reluctantly accepted the resignation of Mrs Helen Griffin who has decided to go into early 'semi - retirement'. Helen has been in the Deputy Principal/ Learning Support Coordinator role here for a little over 7 years. Many of our ākonga have benefitted from Helen's expertise and passion - particularly in learning support across all year groups, AND in early and emergent learning. Helen has also sagely mentored/guided/supported both teaching and support staff too - she will be sorely missed. We will formally farewell Helen at the end of Term 2. HOWEVER, it will not be goodbye as we've already extracted a promise from her that Hokowhitu School will be top of her list for relief and/or part time mahi!

Such great news for you and your whānau Helen.

The Board will soon be advertising for a new Learning Support Coordinator, and an Assistant Principal to form the senior leadership team.

GOAL SETTING EVENINGS

We are looking forward to seeing everyone next week at one of our goal setting evenings. You will have the opportunity to speak with each of the teachers in the kete, share some learning together and hear about your tamariki's current learning goals.

There is no need to make an appointment, just come in between 5.30 and 6.30pm on your day and stay for as long as you'd like.

As a general concept we ask that those who have surnames beginning with A - L come on the 26 March and those with surnames M - Z come on the 27 March. This just helps us balance the numbers over the two evenings. However, if it's not possible for you to come on your night, choose the other.

At the goal setting evening you can request an appointment if you wish to speak in more detail with your child's whānau teacher. Please be aware that their whānau teacher may not be their literacy or numeracy teacher.

As many of the children in Waka will soon be due their 6-week check (which is followed up with a short interview), Mrs Hodge and Miss Caldwell will only be present on ONE of these nights - TUES 26.


