KID LIT QUIZ - A report from Mrs Gifford-Moore

On Tuesday 26th March I took two teams of 4 students to participate in the Kid Lit Quiz competition in Feilding. There were 40 teams altogether of students ranging from primary school to intermediate.

We had the highest score in two of the 10 categories and had to enter a play off with other schools with the same result. We won the 'Unicorn category!' Makayla also won an individual question (competing against 200 students) and was rewarded with \$5!

When the overall results were revealed Hokowhitu A Team (Alex, Makayla, Amos and Catherine) were the top scoring Year 5/6 team, achieving 1st place!

A huge congratulations to all our literacy superstars, it is fantastic to have the opportunity to compete against other students with interests in books.

UPDATE FROM THE SCHOOL BOARD

Tēnā koutou,

Last week the Board held its second meeting of the year, and we want to update you on a few things.

Following a period of consultation, we have now approved the proposed changes to the Communication Policy around student phones and portable digital devices. This ensures we are aligned with the government regulation requiring all schools to have a "phones away for the day" policy in place by the start of term 2. You can read the full policy on our school website.

We are also delighted to see the new senior playground nearing completion! We are currently also working slowly towards a less spectacular but very important project: redesigning and replacing the roof over the Te Kete Wakahuia corridor, to address leaks in the resource room and staffroom. We're also working on a detailed review of the school's property to ensure we're on top of maintenance issues and can make sensible decisions about what and where we invest in improvements.

Finally, we would like to offer some acknowledgements. First, we join with Lin in thanking Helen Griffin for her service to the school as Deputy Principal and Learning Support Coordinator - and for voluntarily attending Board meetings! We also want to thank all the teachers in TKT and TKA who went above and beyond to ensure that the recent camps were safe and successful: Priscilla Gifford Moore, Liz Longley, Jenny Lovegrove, Elisha Masoe, and Sam Sloan. The Board has to sign off on camp because it involves an overnight stay as well as high risk activities, and we knew we could have a lot of confidence in the high-quality health and safety plans that our staff had developed.


Sticker sheets are available from our school office or from your child's kete.
