

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UPDATES

2025 is a year of significant changes in education. Along with the introduction of new curriculum documents for both literacy and numeracy, the government has set a target for 80% of students to be attending school more than 90% of the time. The following diagram outlines the 'traffic light' Stepped Attendance Response that we have been given.



This clearly shows the correlation between regular attendance and likely success as a learner. School aged children should be at school every day, except when they are medically unwell (or in the case of exceptional circumstances such as bereavement).

We are setting goals for attendance here at school and our target for Term 1 is to have 80% of our ākonga attending regularly over the whole school. We have set this target by looking at trends of attendance at our kura in Term 1 over time.

As required, we will be proactive in making contact with whānau if we see patterns of non-attendance developing. This means we can work together to develop a plan to improve regular attendance. Please feel free to make contact with us if you would like to discuss any challenges that you have with getting your tamariki to school on a regular basis.

OTHER IMPORTANT REMINDERS FOR 2025

 The Board has requested that we place ongoing emphasis on correct uniform footwear. Socks should be navy blue, shoes should be black or brown and 'school sensible'. If girls are wearing tights, they are to be plain navy blue tights with feet (NOT leggings). Please ensure the tamariki are wearing these items daily.

We want to take a positive approach to getting this right, so reminder notes will start coming home next week if tamariki are not wearing appropriate footwear.

- 2. Regulation sunhats are compulsory in Term 1. Hats are available from the school office for \$15.00. No hat, no play.
- 3. The school office hours are 8.30am 4.00pm.
- 4. Togs (preferably sunsafe) and a towel should be sent to school daily swimming is a part of the NZ curriculum, not something the children 'choose' to opt in or out of.
- 5. Cell phones are not permitted during the school day. If your child needs to have a cell phone it must be handed in at the start of the day and will be stored in the office until school ends.
- 6. Please do not arrive at school before 8.30am. Early arrivals please wait by the noticeboard, not at your 'meet and greet' points.
- 7. While we encourage the tamariki to farewell their parents/caregiver at the meet and greet point each day, on Friday mornings we welcome everyone into the kete to look through books, enjoy classroom displays and chat with staff. Do take the time to pop in on a Friday morning if you'd like to.

END OF THE DAY TIMES

To minimise congestion with parking etc, we have a split 'end of the day' time. Generally, tamariki in TKW and TKP finish at 2.45pm and those in TKM, TKA and TKT finish at 3pm. We recognise this is not perfect for parents who have children in both areas of the school - we ask that you choose the most suitable time and let the teaching team know whether your children will be 2.45ers or 3pmers!

NB: Children leaving school at 2.45pm MUST be met by an adult as there are no road patrollers out until 3pm. Please try not to chop and change the times, regular routines work best for us all as they are easier to remember.

Isabella - For being an outstanding PA and using her initiative in class.


Senura - For showing kindness and support to his classmates.
