UPDATE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

I would like to say a huge 'tino pai' to everyone involved in the governance and management of our kura - this is a well deserved recognition of the high quality of education Hokowhitu School ākonga are receiving.

KIDS LIT QUIZ

On Monday the 7th of April two teams of 4 students took part in the Kid Lit Quiz competition in Feilding. The teams answered a total of 100 questions. There were 10 questions in each category. Some of the categories included trees, jams and spreads and legends!

The A team - Harrison, Amos, Freddie and **Anita** placed 2nd out of the 19 Year 5/6 teams who participated in the event.

The B team - Aarush, Ruby, Georgia, Minoo placed 3= out of the 19 Year 5/6 teams.

The students spent many weeks preparing for the event with test questions, research and fun in the library. What fantastic results - congratulations both to the ākonga and their coach **Mrs GM**!

REPORTING TO PARENTS

This year we have made some changes to the way we report to parents on progress and 'next step' learning. This has come about by the Ministry of Education's new requirements about standardised testing being required twice per year from Years 3 - 6 (we have previously only used standardised tests once per year.) It seemed to make little sense to us to be administering these assessments in Nov/Dec and then retesting again in Feb/March (as there has been very little formal teaching happening between these dates).

In 2025 we have completed formal testing in Term 1, and have subsequently prepared our first written report that will come home on the 2nd May. We will follow this report up with Celebrating Learning evenings in Week 2 of next term.

The second round of standardised testing will occur towards the end of Term 3 and will be followed up with another written report. This will mean kaiako (teachers) can review and revisit unknown concepts in Term 4.

It is really important that you realise that the report comments around achievement are based on expectations FOR THE END OF THE YEAR, so we would not expect many ākonga (learners) to be AT or ABOVE their end of year expectation after only 10 weeks of the year. Therefore you should not be concerned if they are WORKING TOWARDS EXPECTATION at this stage. This means with ongoing progress over the year, we would expect they will meet the end of year expectations.

ANZAC DAY

This morning the whole school commemorated Anzac Day. Thanks to Mr Hawkins and the student councillors who put this service together.

DRINKS AT SCHOOL

An important reminder that we have a healthy eating and drinking policy at our kura. This states that water is the only drink to be consumed at school for the children. Please do not send your child to school with juice, fizzy, flavoured milk (including Up and Go's), or Yakults - unless there is a medical reason for doing so. If required for medical purposes, please let us know and we can designate a suitable area for consuming these drinks.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UPDATES

2025 is a year of significant changes in education. Along with the introduction of new curriculum documents for both literacy and numeracy, the government has set a target for 80% of students to be attending school more than 90% of the time. Please see recent newsletters for the diagram outlining the 'traffic light' Stepped Attendance Response that we have been given.


School aged children should be at school every day, except when they are medically unwell (or in the case of exceptional circumstances such as bereavement).

We are setting goals for attendance here at school and our target for Term 1 is to have 80% of our ākonga attending regularly over the whole school. We have set this target by looking at trends of attendance at our kura in Term 1 over time.

Attendance data from Week 9 was again lower than our target - we had 75% of the ākonga schoolwide attending regularly (more than 90% of the time).

Let's step that up again next term, we really want to get back into the 80%+ bracket.







Language transmission in multilingual families

We invite you to the first ever multinational study on what might impact parents' decisions to transmit, or not, their home languages to their children. To participate, you need to be over 18, live in Australia, New Zealand, or Singapore, and meet one of the following two criteria:

- In your family more than one language is used or could be used even if it currently is not – and you are a parent or primary carer of at least one child over 2.
 - You have been raised in a bilingual or multilingual family.

You are asked to complete an online survey (available through this link: (https://sunet.artologik.net/kau/Survey/19386) on your language experiences and family circumstances. The survey will take approximately 20–30 minutes (this varies depending on your family situation) and needs to be completed in a single session.

Your response will enhance our understanding of the crucial question of whether to maintain one's home language or not. You can also contact us for questions and concerns.

We're upgrading parts of Fitzherbert Avenue (April-July)

What's happening?

- Repairing the intersection at Fitzherbert >> Four lanes will remain open, but Avenue and Te Awe Awe Street
- Uprading the size of the stormwater pipes from the Fitzherbert Bridge to Hughes Avenue to reduce the chance of flooding
- Repairing handralls on the Fitzherbert Bridge
- Small patches of road repairs along Fitzherbert Avenue towards Ferguson
- the road will look different during construction
- > Footpoths remain open, but both cycle anes will be detoured along this part of Fitzherbert Avenue
- Cyclists heading into town will be detoured via the Victoria Esplanade
- Cyclists heading to Summerfull will be toured via Hughes Avenue


