The tamariki have worked hard to earn STRIVE vouchers all term. Part of the voucher goes into one of the jars in the office as a vote towards a 'whole school reward' at the end of the term. The winning reward for this term is a 'non uniform' day, so next Friday the 11 April, school uniform does not need to be worn to school.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UPDATES

2025 is a year of significant changes in education. Along with the introduction of new curriculum documents for both literacy and numeracy, the government has set a target for 80% of students to be attending school more than 90% of the time. Please see recent newsletters for the diagram outlining the 'traffic light' Stepped Attendance Response that we have been given.

School aged children should be at school every day, except when they are medically unwell (or in the case of exceptional circumstances such as bereavement).


We are setting goals for attendance here at school and our target for Term 1 is to have 80% of our ākonga attending regularly over the whole school. We have set this target by looking at trends of attendance at our kura in Term 1 over time.

Attendance data from Week 8 was again lower than our target - we had 78% of the ākonga schoolwide attending regularly (more than 90% of the time). We are getting close again!

Let's step that up again, we really want to get back into the 80%+ bracket.

Update from the School Board

Tēnā koutou,

Last week the Board held its second meeting of the year, after we want to acknowledge how much has happened since the start of the school year. In the last couple of weeks, we have had an ERO evaluation visit and the annual visit from our auditor. Our staff are beginning to teach not one but two new curriculums: literacy and maths. And of course, there's a building project!

The roof replacement project is funded by the Ministry of Education as part of our ten year property plan, and it's taken a long time to get from an item on a plan to having contractors on site. I want to especially acknowledge the time that Lin and Villi (our property portfolio holder) have put into this process, including meetings during the last summer holidays.

So far this year we've also approved the school budget for the year, which includes a significant increase in spending on learning coaches. Also, we've reviewed several key policies as part of our regular review cycle. Revised policies on delegations and child protection have been approved and can now be found on the school website, and reviews of the assessment and health and safety policies are underway.

Looking ahead, we want to signal that the next Board elections will take place in term 3. We will provide more information about this process over the next few months, and more insight into what's involved in being on the Board, but for now it's worth thinking about whether you might be interested in putting yourself forward for such a role - or encouraging someone you think should have a go!



What's happening?

- ▶ Repairing the intersection at Fitzherbert Avenue and Te Awe Awe Street
- ▶ Upgrading the size of the stormwater pipes from the Fitzherbert Bridge to Hughes Avenue to reduce the chance of flooding
- ▶ Repairing handrails on the Fitzherbert Bridge
- ▶ Small patches of road repairs along Fitzherbert Avenue towards Ferguson Street
- ▶ Four lanes will remain open, but the road will look different during construction
- ▶ Footpaths remain open, but both cycle lanes will be detoured along this part of Fitzherbert Avenue
- ▶ Cyclists heading into town will be detoured via the Victoria Esplanade
- ▶ Cyclists heading to Summerhill will be detoured via Hughes Avenue




