# **UPDATE FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

Kia ora koutou Ngā mihi kia koutou

Welcome to term 2. I hope everyone got to do something enjoyable over the term break - we certainly enjoyed some lovely weather here in the mighty Manawatu.

A special welcome to the new ākonga and their whānau who have joined our kura this term. We hope that you feel very welcome. Please ask someone if you have any queries or things that need clarification.

We formally welcomed new children and staff with a mihi whakatau on Monday morning.

# This is an example of us working within our second strategic goal - increasing ākonga and kaiako knowledge of and engagement with te ao Māori.

#### **REPORTING TO PARENTS**

This year we have made some changes to the way we report to parents on progress and 'next step' learning. This has come about by the Ministry of Education's new requirements about standardised testing being required twice per year from Years 3 - 6 (we have previously only used standardised tests once per year.) It made little sense to us to be administering these assessments in Nov/Dec and then retesting again in Feb/March (as there has been very little formal teaching happening between these dates).

In 2025 we have completed formal testing in Term 1, and have subsequently prepared our first written report that comes home today. We will follow this report up with 'Celebrating Learning' evenings next Monday and Tuesday evening.

The second round of standardised testing will occur towards the end of Term 3 and will be followed up with another written report. This will mean kaiako (teachers) can review and revisit unknown concepts in Term 4.

It is really important that you realise that the report comments around achievement are based on expectations FOR THE END OF THE YEAR, so we would not expect many ākonga (learners) to be AT or ABOVE their end of year expectation after only 10 weeks of the year. Therefore you should not be concerned if they are WORKING TOWARDS EXPECTATION at this stage. This means with ongoing progress over the year, we would expect they will meet the end of year expectations.

#### **CELEBRATING LEARNING EVENINGS**

We hope that everyone will take the opportunity to come to one of these evenings next week. It is a great way for you to informally chat with all the teachers that interact with your child on a daily basis. There is also time for you to have a good look at books, art work etc together. Come at any time between 5.30pm and 6.30pm - kaiako have prepared activities for you to enjoy with your tamariki while waiting for a chat with a teacher. We request that those with surnames starting from A - L come on Monday, and M - Z come on Tuesday - this is to assist with even numbers each evening. However, it is ok to come on the other evening if you have prior commitments.

#### **IMPORTANT REMINDERS**

- 1. The playground at Hokowhitu Park is NOT part of our school and is not supervised or monitored by anyone. We strongly discourage the children playing there either before or after school unless they have a parent/guardian actively supervising them it simply isn't safe.
- 2. We are a 'water only' school, please don't send other drinks (unless there is a medical reason).
- 3. In the cooler months, some children like to wear 'layers' under the school uniform. If that layer is under a skort it should be navy blue stockings, NOT footless tights. Alternatively, If the layer is a thermal top under their t-shirt, this should be not visible OR be plain red or navy blue. Socks should be navy blue and shoes are to be plain black or brown and school sensible. We have been advised by Academy Apparel that the small sizes of navy shorts and pants will very soon be back in stock hopefully as early as next week.

#### ANZAC DAY SERVICE



Some of our school Ambassadors represented our Hokowhitu School community at the Palmerston North Anzac Civic Service. They were a part of the Anzac parade and laid a wreath made by Hokowhitu School students during the service. Well done to these Ambassadors for representing us through their school holidays on such an important day.



#### **MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UPDATES**

2025 is a year of significant changes in education. Along with the introduction of new curriculum documents for both literacy and numeracy, the government has set a target for 80% of students to be attending school more than 90% of the time. Please see Term 1 newsletters for the diagram outlining the 'traffic light' Stepped Attendance Response that we have been given.

School aged children should be at school every day, except when they are medically unwell (or in the case of exceptional circumstances such as bereavement).

We are setting goals for attendance here at school and our target for Term 2 is to have 78% of our ākonga attending regularly over the whole school. We have set this target by making a small allowance for winter illnesses.

# We achieved our school wide term 1 target with 80% of our ākonga attending school for 90% or more of the time. Ka pai - let's celebrate with an extended morning tea break next Monday!

You will be advised of your child's term one attendance in this year's first written report that came home today. We want to work together to develop a plan to improve regular attendance. Please make contact with us if you would like to discuss any challenges that you have with getting your tamariki to school on a regular basis.


