**Cost:** \$40 per player (plus \$5 for uniform hire if you have not hired a uniform in 2025 yet)

Time: (Be aware that times may change due to number of entries)

Children will play in grades according to their year group (age) and teams will be mixed gender.

For safety reasons, it is compulsory that teams in all grades:

- Must wear footwear (i.e., running shoes, touch shoes, moulds).
- Screw in and/or metal sprigs are NOT permitted. Moulded ONLY
- Jewellery is NOT to be worn.


