Next week is Māori Language week 2025 - <u>Te Wiki o te Reo Māori</u>. This takes place from Sunday, September 14th to Saturday, September 20th. This year marks the 50th anniversary of the event, which grew from a single day in 1972 to a full week celebrating the Māori language and culture.

The theme for 2025 is "Ake ake ake - A forever language".

ASSESSMENT, SCHOOL REPORTS AND CELEBRATING LEARNING

The teaching team has completed another round of assessment and are currently writing your child's second written report. We have adjusted our assessment and reporting schedule this year to enable us to have Term 4 to revisit any gaps or consolidate concepts before the end of the year.

This report will come home at the end of the first week of next term.

The Ministry of Education has issued statements to let everyone know that the new curriculum expectations in literacy and numeracy have changed - MORE is being expected of the ākonga.

This means that some teacher judgments about below/at/above expectations may differ from previous years, simply because teachers are working hard to bring the learners up to the new expectations. This is along with introducing concepts that they have not been taught previously.

THIS DOES NOT MEAN YOUR CHILD HAS 'GONE BACKWARDS' OR 'STOPPED LEARNING'. The goal posts have been shifted and so it is more challenging to be 'at' or 'above' expectation at the appropriate year level.

As usual we will follow up with open evenings to 'celebrate learning' the week after reports have been issued. We hope that you can come along on one of these nights and take the opportunity to view learning and chat with staff.

SUN HATS

Our school policy requires that all tamariki wear our regulation navy blue bucket sunhat in Terms 4 and 1 of each year. The NZ sun is fierce and sunburn can be most uncomfortable and sometimes dangerous.

Now is the time to check the drawers and make sure you have the hat ready for the beginning of next term. Sunhats are available for purchase from the school office for \$15.00 if you need one. We have hats in stock right now.




