COHORT ENTRY

You will recall that the School Board has been in consultation regarding commencing cohort entry at our kura. In line with the feedback received, at last week's Board meeting the board moved to adopt cohort entry for New Entrants from the commencement of Term 1 2026. The motion was unanimously approved.

This means Term 1 2026 New Entrants will start on either the 4th February or the 9th March - depending on when they turn 5 years of age.
