Kia ora koutou Ngā mihi kia koutou

We farewelled Jennifer Bates today - each kete has had an opportunity to give their goodbye, thank you and 'go well' messages to Mrs Bates. Thank you for everything you have given and achieved at our kura Jen - we will definitely miss you!

On the first day of next term we will be welcoming Mrs Marie Greig who will be joining us as our new Office Manager. Marie has extensive administrative experience, alongside a great set of 'front facing' skills. We are confident that she will quickly adapt into the role - please be patient and show atawhai as Marie learns new names and systems.

PUANGA/MATARIKI CELEBRATIONS

Matariki is a time for remembrance, celebrating the present and looking to the future. Matariki is a time of reflection, celebrations and preparation.

- Matariki Hunga Nui Remembrance, honouring those we have lost since the last rising Matariki
- Matariki Ahunga Nui Celebrating the present, gathering together to give thanks for what we have
- Matariki Manako Nui Looking forward to the promise of a new year.

Matariki mā puanga means Matariki (Pleiades) and Puanga (Rigel) and this phrase acknowledges the relationship between these stars. Both Matariki and Puanga rise in the eastern sky before the sun during the winter period, however some tribes and regions of the country look to Puanga instead of Matariki as the main marker of the New Year.

While the stars that mark the beginning of the Yew year may vary in some regions the themes that underpin the ceremony and celebration are the same. We acknowledge our past, celebrate the present and look forward to a bright and prosperous future. The phrase Matriki mā Puanga is essentially a reminder that regardless of our different backgrounds, origins, and practices we use this celebration to come together and share the many unique elements that shape our identity. The 2025 theme of Matariki mā Puanga is all about inclusion, embracing diversity and celebrating Matariki together. Matariki and Puanga are stars that sit in the night sky together to signal the start of the Māori new year for different iwi. Matariki mā Puanga acknowledges and embraces the different traditions, stars and tikanga around celebrating the Māori New Year, recognising the regional variations. We can all connect to the core values of Matariki and Puanga and embrace the diverse ways for marking the new year. Mātauranga (traditional knowledge) is not held by one person in one place - it is held by many people across the motu. We can all play a part in learning and sharing mātauranga so that regional Matariki or Puanga traditions thrive for generations.

Everyone had 'loads of fun' this afternoon learning more (in their house groups) about Puanga/Matariki, Māori crafts and games.
